ELECTION OF DIRECTORS/OFFICERS

As per Clause 29 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

29.1 (a) Nominations for candidates to be elected to the Management Committee shall be called for by the

Association forty-two days prior to the Annual General Meeting.

(b) When calling for nominations the Association shall also provide details of the necessary qualifications

including the requirements under the Act and job description for the positions (if any). Qualifications

- and job descriptions shall be as determined by the Management Committee from time to time.
- (c) Nominations of candidates for election as Committee Members (including the President) shall be:
 - (i) made in writing, signed by two Members and accompanied by the written consent of the nominee (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination) and
 - (ii) delivered to the Association not less than (14) days before the date fixed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting, and the Association shall send the nominations to the Members entitled to receive notice under this Constitution together with the agenda for that General Meeting.
- (d) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all available vacancies on the Management Committee
 - the candidates nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected declaration by the chairman, be deemed to be elected.
- (e) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected, declaration by the Chairman be deemed to be elected.
- (f) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, voting papers shall be prepared containing the names of the candidates in alphabetical order, for each vacancy on the Management Committee.

VOTING

As per Clauses 23, 24, 25 & 29 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

- 23.4 At any meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by:
 - (a) the chairman; or
 - (b) a simple majority of Members, who are eligible to vote as per Clause 11
- 24.1 Each member over the age of 15 years and entitled to vote as set out in Clause 11.1 shall have one vote at General Meetings which, subject to this Constitution, shall be exercised by that Member.
- 24.2 Where voting at General Meetings is equal, the chairman may exercise a casting vote.
- 25 (a) Proxy voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 25 (b) Postal voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 29.2 Elections shall be conducted by secret ballet and otherwise by such means as is prescribed by the Management Committee.

Thank you to everyone for another great 2021/2022 season on North Kirra Beach! Over a massive 5147.5 total patrolling (and water safety) hours at North Kirra beach, we have seen 7,850 swimmers between our flags and 89,481 beach users. With these huge numbers of people on our beach, it is a testament to our patrolling members supervision and preventative actions that 2,152 people were warned. In addition, 61 instances of first aid were provided to beach users.

Our patrol strength has been shown continually despite challenges of COVID isolations, some crazy weather events and flooding. We have strong and established patrol groups that rarely need assistance to fill patrol requirements. With 12 patrol groups, most people were rostered 1 patrol per 3 weeks not including public holidays. This ensures people are not required to be on patrol every week although some have chosen to. This shows that with the assistance of everyone, however much it may be, together as a club we can provide this vital community service.



We have had 3 patrol inspections this year, all of which we were given 100% scores on! This shows that North Kirra has all equipment in appropriate condition, the correct procedures in place to meet patrol requirements and members that are skilled and knowledgeable.


Although our perfect scores of patrol inspections show we are continuing to meet patrol requirements, upskilling members is an important part of our ongoing patrol strength for further years. This season we have had 8 members from the U14 nipper age group gain their Surf Rescue Certificate over their SRC camp and go on to join patrol groups. Additionally, 6 new and continuing members have gained their Bronze Medallion. We have

also had many patrol members renew expiring awards and gaining new awards including IRB crew and drivers certificates. This further improves our patrol strength and ensure continued education.

Looking forward to next year, we hope to continue to encourage new membership, nippers progressing through junior and into the senior club and retaining the amazing members we already have. We appreciate the commitment and continue to encourage our youth members who are making the effort to patrol in a stage of life where life commitments can make it hard at times.

Special thanks must go to Aurah for her assistance as Vice Club Captain over the past couple of years, making the job of Club Captain that much easier. Thanks also to Meagan Lowns for her assistance with the paperwork and office requirements associated with patrols and proficiencies.

Finally, thank you to all our patrolling members for their efforts this year in patrolling the beach and also taking great care of the equipment that we need to keep the beach safe. Also, a big thank you to our



patrol captains who are not only extremely knowledgeable but amazing leaders and mentors to their patrol groups and the younger members in our club. We are looking forward to a well-deserved off season and another great 2022/2023 season!

The club is extremely grateful to everyone who contributed their time and efforts.

North Kirra had four courses that ran throughout this season. One Bronze Course, one IRB Drivers Course, one IRB Crewperson Course and the SRC Course. There were 6 members in the Bronze Course, 3 in the IRB Crew Course, another 3 in the IRB Drivers Course and 8 nippers in the SRC award. All members were successful in achieving their awards with everyone passing with flying colours. I would like to thank Craig Lowns, Michael Delahunt, David Macknish and Josh Clemson for their help with training and assessing the Bronze Course and I would like to thank again Michael Delahunt and Josh Clemson for their help with both IRB courses.

We also had the SRC camp again this year which was a lot of fun. Thank you to Paul Nel, Under 14s Age Manager, and his team for letting me jump on the SRC camp. As Age Managers, you guys did a great job throughout the years which made the whole weekend run smoothly.





I would like to give Meagan Lowns a massive thank you for getting all the paperwork completed and doing all the behind the scenes work that made the training run smoothly.

Can't wait to see what training lays ahead for next season.

Treasurer's Report

It has been another busy year for the surf club resulting in a strong financial position for the club. The financial performance speaks to the great support from our members, staff, and the general community. Including thousands of hours of volunteer time throughout the year at nippers, carnivals, and events. We are truly thankful to everyone for their support of North Kirra. We have stood together throughout the challenging times of the past few years, and our club is much stronger because of it.

The committee has continued to execute against the projects outlined in the strategic plan. Over the past 12 months significant work and investment has gone into the female and male surf and supporters club bathroom renovations, the opening of the new Café and the upgraded office. Over \$160,000 was invested in these projects over the past year.

With regards to surf club equipment, we invested in six new rescue boards, twelve new nipper boards and a new 4WD for the club.

On the horizon for next year, we will be investing in a new outer deck roof for the supporter's club and finalising the upgrade to the female dorm room bathrooms. Additionally, we will be upgrading the Supporter Club doors to be automatic opening. Planning will also begin for the outside garage which is expected to be located on the south side of the club.

The Supporter's Club had a relatively strong performance during this financial year. During this financial year a total of \$280,000 was donated to the Surf Club, which is an exceptional result. This strong financial performance has resulted in solid cash reserves for the club exceeding \$660,000 at the end of the Financial Year. This positions the Club in a very strong situation to plan for the future and ensure we can continue to maintain and optimise our facilities.

Thank you to our valuable members that continue to volunteer their time and to the public for their donations and support for both the Supporters club and our local events. As always, the phenomenal North Kirra community has demonstrated the strong culture of support and dedication we have in our club. I encourage all members to review the financials from page 43 of this Annual Report for further detail on income and expenditure items.



Supporters' Club Report

Another year has quickly flown by and we have continued to be affected by and had to manage the impacts of COVID-19. It is almost hard to remember all the changes we have had to navigate this year, but if nothing else we became very adaptable to the changing conditions around us.

Being located close to the Qld/NSW border, the hard border closure between the states had quite an impact on trade with many tourists and interstate residents unable to visit the club. For those that could visit the club, we had the additional measures in place that needed to be managed like the utilisation of the Qld Check In App and confirming our patrons vaccination status. This all made for a very challenging few months in the first half of the year.

But then we hit the Christmas holiday period and the borders were opened and trade really took off again. We did however have to abide by COVID isolation rules which had quite an impact on staffing availability throughout January particularly. Trading hours had to be amended to cater for the workforce that was available to us. But we have passed on from that now and look to more positive times ahead. The international borders are back open again, isolation rules have been relaxed and visitation to the Club has been strong since.

Like previous years, we have continued to reinvest in the Supporters Club with the removal of the coolroom from behind the bar. It was seriously waterlogged and causing issues to our downstairs ceilings, and with the bathroom renovation underway downstairs, it was time for it to go. We also upgraded our bathroom facilities upstairs, retiling the bathrooms and investing in new toilets, vanities and partitioning across all 3 bathrooms, along with a repaint of the areas. They now look modern and refreshed and will be ready for plenty of use in the years ahead. We also invested in an electronic sign in system to replace the paper-based system that was in place prior to COVID and as this report is being written, we have also just put in automatic entry doors to the Club. This all improves the experience of our patrons upon arrival at the Club.

The biggest achievement this year would have to be the opening of NK Café, downstairs on the beachside of the Club. Operated by the Supporters Club, this additional outlet opens 7 mornings a week, providing coffee and light snacks to the local and passing trade. This expands the income streams of the club and as time goes on, the menu range will expand in line with the growth of the market.

This is very popular on weekends, especially during the surf season, and was a hit when North Kirra SLSC was hosting carnivals. We are excited about the future prospects of this new venture.

Staff recruitment, in order to meet our increased trade levels, has remained the biggest challenge this past year. This is an industry wide problem and even extends across many other industries, so we just have to continue to try our best to attract and retain a team in our great venue. A personal thank you to all the team that have given their best over the past year in what have been the most challenging of times. We are often only the messenger but have to face the





challenges of the industry, but we as a team we performed well to achieve our results. Congratulations!

Once again, my sincere appreciation to the supportive committee that have that have assisted me to navigate the way over the past couple of years. It has been a tremendous team effort and together we all achieved a strong result again this year.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 April 2022

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The Committee has prepared the financial statements of the club on the basis that the club is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the club constitution, the information needs of the beneficiaries and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the trustees have determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or at independent of committees' valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in members funds. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by trustees to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are recognised as expenses in profit or loss during the financial period in which they are incurred.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis and include direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead expenses.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet

(d) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(f) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables, including bank borrowings and distributions payable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money.

(g) Leases

The club as lessee

Leases are classified as right of use assets whenever the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration. Where the lease term is 12 months or less or the lease value is less than \$5000 it will be classified as operating leases.

At inception the rights to use assets held are recognised as such as part of property, plant and equipment in the same way as owned assets. The corresponding liability to the lessor is included in the balance sheet as a lease liability. Lease payments are apportioned between the interest component and the reduction of the lease liability. The interest component is recognised in profit or loss in the period in which it arises.

Rentals payable under operating leases are recognised in profit or loss.
