ELECTION OF DIRECTORS/OFFICERS

As per Clause 29 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

- 29.1 (a) Nominations for candidates to be elected to the Management Committee shall be called for by the Association forty-two days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- (b) When calling for nominations the Association shall also provide details of the necessary qualifications including the requirements under the Act and job description for the positions (if any). Qualifications and job descriptions shall be as determined by the Management Committee from time to time.
- (c) Nominations of candidates for election as Committee Members (including the President) shall be:
- (i) made in writing, signed by two Members and accompanied by the written consent of the nominee (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination) and
 - (ii) delivered to the Association not less than (14) days before the date fixed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting, and the Association shall send the nominations to the Members entitled to receive notice under this Constitution together with the agenda for that General Meeting.
- (d) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all available vacancies on the Management Committee the candidates nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected declaration by the chairman, be deemed to be elected.
- (e) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected, declaration by the Chairman be deemed to be elected.
- (f) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, voting papers shall be prepared containing the names of the candidates in alphabetical order, for each vacancy on the Management Committee.

VOTING

As per Clauses 23, 24, 25 & 29 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

- 23.4 At any meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by:
- (a) the chairman; or
 - (b) a simple majority of Members, who are eligible to vote as per Clause 11
- 24.1 Each member over the age of 15 years and entitled to vote as set out in Clause 11.1 shall have one vote at General Meetings which, subject to this Constitution, shall be exercised by that Member.
- 24.2 Where voting at General Meetings is equal, the chairman may exercise a casting vote.
- 25 (a) Proxy voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 25 (b) Postal voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 29.2 Elections shall be conducted by secret ballot and otherwise by such means as is prescribed by the Management Committee.

North Kirra has members from diverse backgrounds that all come together to make the club what it is and in return as a Club, we offer an inclusive program aimed at giving all our members the best opportunities to grow and excel in our lifesaving community. Our training opportunities are available as a result of our volunteer trainers giving their time, so I thank my co-trainers Josh, Isaac & David for their contributions this season.

2022/2023 was a quieter season for carnivals at North Kirra, only hosting the Gold Coast City Titles in November 2022. But once again, our volunteer members rose to the occasion to help out and make it a success. It is income from these carnivals that really drives our fundraising efforts for the club, and this season we were pleased to start off the season with a new Isuzu 4WD and a new ATV amongst other equipment. Congratulations also to Josh Clemson who achieved his Assessors qualification this season across Bronze and IRB awards. Also, thank you to the support personnel that help out with the courses, including Mick Delahunt and also Meagan Lowns with the paperwork side of the training.

North Kirra has 10 members who achieved their Bronze Medallion this season, 6 of these new or returning members and the other 4 our SRCs upgrading their qualification to Bronze. We had a small group of Under 14s in the Nippers this season, meaning there was only 2 members to achieve their SRC award this time around. We also had 6 of our members complete their IRB Crew Certificate and 2 members receive their Silver Medallion IRB Drivers Award. All of these awards assist in expanding the skill set of our members on our patrols, making sure there is enough coverage of awards around member absences. Thank you to all our members for contributing their time to extend their skills.



This season we also completed the five proficiency sessions in the first half of the season. It was great to see some good turnouts, particularly in the earlier sessions. The Run-Swim-Run and board and tube rescues were completed and resuscitation and other skills refreshed in line with any changes related to education. Thank you to everyone that assisted with the sessions and to the members that completed their annual training to continue the high standards at North Kirra.

We look forward to the season ahead, getting underway with a Bronze Course to start off the season.

Treasurer's Report

It has been another busy year for the Surf Club resulting in a strong financial position for the club. The financial performance speaks to the great support from our members, staff, and the general community, including thousands of hours of volunteer time throughout the year at nippers, carnivals and events. We are truly thankful to everyone for their support of North Kirra.

The committee has continued to execute against the projects outlined in the Strategic Plan. Over the past 12 months significant work and investment has gone into finalising the female dorm room bathroom upgrades including ensuite renovation. Additionally, the new outer deck roof for the Supporters Club was installed, alongside a new kitchen oven and exhaust system and an extension to the cool room. New automatic doors were added to the Supporter's Club entry which have been well received by patrons. The external walls of the building also received a full repaint which freshened up the look of the club. Over \$120,000 was invested in these projects over the past year.

On the horizon for next year, planning will also begin for the outside garage which is expected to be located on the south side of the club. Discussions are currently underway with planners to understand viable extension options.

With regards to Surf Club equipment, we invested in a new ATV for the club. Carnival income and expenses were down this year as we only hosted Gold Coast City Titles this year.

The Supporter's Club had a relatively strong performance during this financial year. During this financial year a total of \$390,000 was donated to the Surf Club, which is an exceptional result. This strong financial performance has resulted in solid cash reserves for the club exceeding \$837,000 at the end of the Financial Year. This positions us in a very strong situation to plan for the future and ensure we can continue to maintain and optimise our facilities.

Thank you to our valuable members that continue to volunteer their time and to the public for their donations and support for both the Supporters Club and our local events. As always, the phenomenal North Kirra community has demonstrated the strong culture of support and dedication we have in our club. I encourage all members to review the financials from page 45 of this Annual Report for further detail on income and expenditure items.

Throughout the season our Nippers represented North Kirra at Junior Branch and Junior State Carnivals. I again commend our nippers on their effort and success but most importantly their sportsmanship at each event. Thank you to the small but dedicated group that give their time to support our carnival team.

Volunteering at Nippers

Our Nippers program is 100% volunteer based. A normal Sunday at nippers needs approximately 100 hours of volunteer time to run each week. 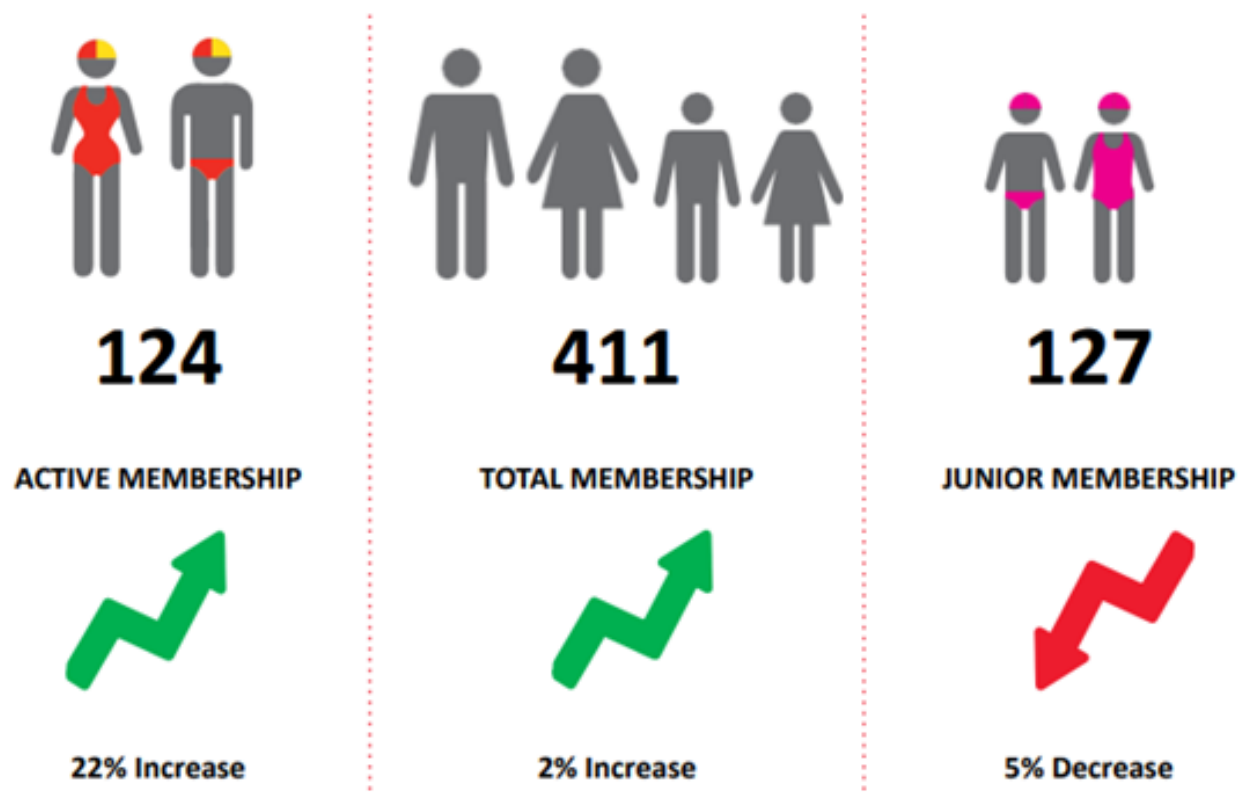

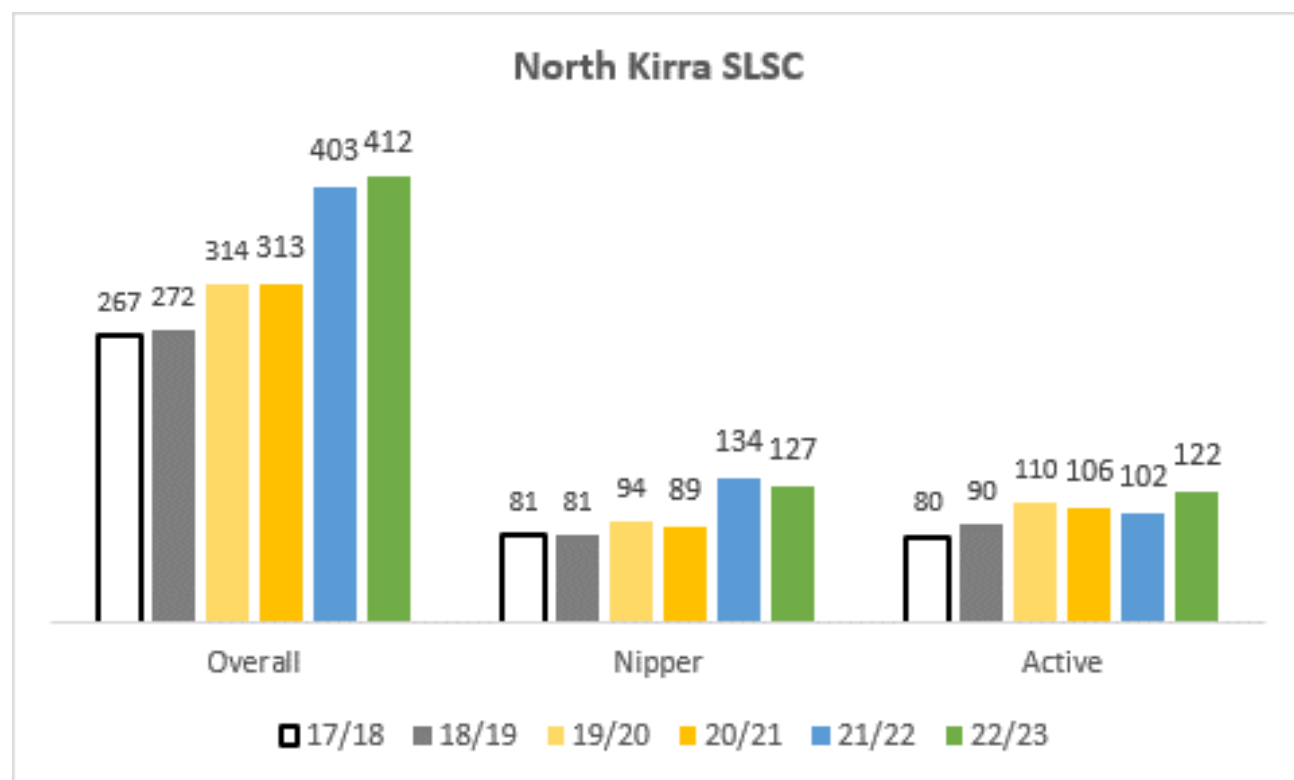
