ELECTION OF DIRECTORS/OFFICERS

As per Clause 30 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

30.1 Nominations of Candidates

- (a) Nominations for candidates to be elected to the Management Committee shall be called for by the Association forty-two days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- (b) When calling for nominations the Association shall also provide details of the necessary qualifications including the requirements under the Act and job description for the positions (if any). Qualifications and job descriptions shall be as determined by the Management Committee from time to time.
- (c) Nominations of candidates for election as Committee Members (including the President) shall be:
 - (i) made in writing, signed by two Members and accompanied by the written consent of the nominee (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination); and
 - (ii) delivered to the Association not less than 14 days before the date fixed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting, and the Association shall send the nominations to the Members entitled to receive notice under this Constitution together with the agenda for that General Meeting.
- (d) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all available vacancies on the Management Committee the candidates nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected declaration by the chairman, be deemed to be elected.
- (e) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall, subject to a secret ballot by the Members confirming their election and if elected, declaration by the chairman be deemed to be elected.
- (f) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, voting papers shall be prepared containing the names of the candidates in alphabetical order, for each vacancy on the Management Committee.
- (g) The voting members have the right to reject any nomination regardless of its validity by a simple majority vote

VOTING

As per Clauses 24, 25, 26 & 30 of the North Kirra SLSC Constitution

- 24.4 At any meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by:
 - (a) the chairman; or
 - (b) a simple majority of Members, who are eligible to vote as per Clause 12
- 25.1 Each member over the age of 15 years and entitled to vote as set out in Clause 12 shall have one vote at General Meetings which, subject to this Constitution, shall be exercised by that Member.
- 25.2 Where voting at General Meetings is equal, the chairman may exercise a casting vote.
- 26 (a) Proxy voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 26 (b) Postal voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.
- 30.2 Elections shall be conducted by secret ballet and otherwise by such means as is prescribed by the Management Committee.

1930-2024

In August 2024, we lost Life Member No. 3 – Claude Williams

Claude passed his Bronze Medallion on February 1st 1959 and was awarded Life Membership No. 3 of North Kirra in 1961.

Claude was instrumental in the building of the new Clubhouse from 1959. Claude was the only qualified carpenter as a member of North Kirra, and his enthusiasm and determination had him complete the construction of the two-story Clubhouse in twelve months, working tirelessly every weekend. The only assistance he had was from thirty odd "very unqualified" club members. That original Clubhouse is still the centre of the Supporters Club and Surf Club today, sixty-five years later.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 24/25 was a big year for the club, starting with the celebration of the club's 75 years and ending with hosting The Aussies. I cannot speak highly enough of all of our amazing members who get in and get the job done and make NK shine.

The club was recognised for its efforts of Season 23/24 with being awarded the PDB Nipper and PDB Youth Club of the Year, and I was also proud to be honoured with the Clive Hammond OAM Silver Medal. We were also once again Runner Up in the PDB Patrol Club of the Year Award. These awards are great recognition of the efforts of our members.

Our memberships for the season held steady and we had another good year in the area of education. With 5 proficiency sessions and courses across Bronze, SRC and First Aid/ART along with vehicle inductions, we continued to develop the skills of our members. 838 awards in total were achieved and I thank Josh and David for their commitment to training this season. The season was not without its disruptions though, with Cyclone Alfred hitting the Gold Coast in March. This managed to cause the cancellation of both the Qld Youth and Senior/Masters Championships; luckily conditions improved just in time for The Aussies.

CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER'S REPORT

Throughout the 2024-2025 season, the framework of training within Point Danger Branch was reviewed and underwent significant changes to assist the eleven clubs. The branch appointed Derek Baldwin as the Point Danger Branch Education and Training Advisor. As such, PDB has coordinated increased training opportunities for all clubs which have been run by the Education and Training Advisor. This has taken the pressure off clubs to qualify trainers across all awards.

In 2024-2025, North Kirra planned two Bronze Medallion/SRC courses. The September-November course qualified 6 club members with their Bronze Medallion and 1 senior and 12 youth with their Surf Rescue Certificate. Unfortunately, the February Bronze Medallion course was cancelled due to insufficient interest. A further 3 members attained their IRB Crew accreditation, being added to the club's growing coffers of members able to perform the critical task of IRB rescues. Importantly, many participants from each of these courses continued on to join patrol groups and have been active in their surf lifesaving commitments.

This season, North Kirra also hosted a combined First Aid/ Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) course which was well-attended by 12 members. This instantly grew our first aid qualifications in most of our patrol groups. Next season, it is intended to ensure that the Bronze Medallion course to commence the season combines with a

joint First Aid/ ART course on the final day to provide these members with these three significant awards in one hit – Bronze Medallion, First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques.

Thanks must go to all club trainers, assessors, and administrators – Meagan Lowns, Craig Lowns, Josh Clemson, David Macknish – in addition to the support and assistance of our Club Captain, Mick Delahunt, for their passion and commitment to ensuring the regular and consistent development of our patrolling ranks and their skills. Thank you to all participants who have been acclimating to the new online registration process and the aXcelerate platform.

Leading into the next season, it is hoped to introduce an intraclub patrol inspection competition to continue to revise and build our skills in both practical and theoretical applications.

Additionally, inter-patrol and individual Champion Lifesaver competitions are on the drawing board as we prepare to reignite our participation in the PDB Surf Rescue Championships. Following a lengthy period of healthy participation, member availability for this competition last season was limited; we hope that the scheduling this season is more to our liking and families' availabilities.

Congratulations to all those who have undertaken courses across this last season. In order to be eligible for the PDB Club of the Year, we need to increase our number of awards achieved in the season beyond the







previous season. Hence, to be fully recognised as the best club in the branch, I challenge all new and existing members to commit to adding at least one new qualification per season.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is a pleasure to report on another strong financial year for North Kirra, reaffirming the club's solid financial foundation and ongoing stability.

Despite several weather-related disruptions to our planned events, the Club continued to perform well financially. One of the year's highlights was the successful hosting of the 2024 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships (Aussies) in March and April. Thanks to the dedication and commitment of our committee, members, and volunteers, the Club generated in excess of \$83,000 in revenue. Much of this will be reinvested into critical equipment and facility upgrades—including new racing mals and much-needed nipper boards for our 13 and 14-year-olds, who represent the future of North Kirra.

In alignment with our long-term strategic plan, construction is now underway on the extension of the southern garage and storage area. This project will enhance the safe and secure storage of our lifesaving equipment, while also creating space within the Club for better organisation of nipper and training gear. To date, we've invested over \$50,000, with completion targeted before the start of the 2025/26 patrol season. We continue to explore additional infrastructure improvements, including solar panel installations, club extensions, operational resilience during extreme weather events and expanded parking facilities.

A noteworthy financial milestone this year has been the continued growth of our long-term investments. We have allocated \$1,000,000 to low-risk, interest-bearing accounts, which earned over \$48,000 in returns. These funds will be used to support the completion of the southern garage extension and similar future projects. The committee will continue to monitor cash flow needs while pursuing this prudent investment strategy.

The consistent profitability and hard work of the Supporters Club has also contributed significantly to our success. Regular monthly donations in excess of \$30,000 from the Supporters Club to the Surf Club have continued throughout the year—an extraordinary achievement. It truly sets North Kirra apart from other clubs.

In addition, we successfully secured over \$48,000 in grant funding. Special thanks go to Meagan, whose tireless efforts in this highly competitive space have delivered outstanding results. The committee remains committed to growing this important revenue stream in the coming year.

Most proudly, I report that our audited financial statements show we finished the year with strong cash reserves of \$1,512,195. This positions the Club well to continue to deliver on our long-term strategic goals. For those interested in further details, I encourage you to review the financial statements within the Annual Report. I also welcome any questions or discussions regarding our financial performance.

In closing, sincere thanks go to our dedicated volunteers, generous donors, and the broader community for their ongoing support. The spirit of North Kirra was on full display during the Aussies—numerous attendees commented on the energy, camaraderie, and professionalism shown over the course of the nine day event. That a Club of our size could deliver such an outstanding result speaks volumes about the strength of our people. The Club's financial success reflects the collective efforts of these people - our members, staff, volunteers, and supporters. We are deeply grateful for everything you do to support North Kirra. Here's to an even bigger 2025/26.

CLUBHOUSE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Another great and busy season for North Kirra Surf Club thanks to all our wonderful members who pitched in to help make our Club one of the best little Surf Clubs around.

This past season has been more about maintaining our facilities as we consolidate our funds to plan for future renovations and upgrades. The first of those upgrades is now underway - that being the garage extension. This project, expected to cost around \$150,000, should be completed in the next month or two, providing the club will some further storage area for equipment like the arena, tractor and trailers, freeing up some valuable space internally in the club.

We have also started discussion with City of Gold Coast to upgrade the grassed area on the beach side of the footpath. Recently they have completed an upgrade on the club side of the footpath, greatly improving the area out the front of the café and included a new concrete driveway access for the club. We thank the Council for undertaking this project, and hopefully the other side will also get upgraded in the near future. This would not only improve the look of the area but also facilitate the recovery of the area post events like Aussies that utilise that area with quite a bit of infrastructure.

The one main investment item of this season was the installation of a solar system to help reduce our electricity costs. With panels installed on about half of the club's roof area, this has helped reduce our electricity costs by about \$1,500-\$2,000 per month – a great investment for the club. Once further decisions are made about future extensions, the plan is to install a second inverter with additional panels to further reduce the electricity costs.

I am pleased to report that the club fared well during Cyclone Alfred, the first cyclone to hit the Gold Coast area in over 50 years. Unlike many of the other Gold Coast beaches, North Kirra retained much of its sand, although we did have a lot to start with. Water came nowhere near the club, other than due to a lack of power for stormwater pit pumps to operate. We had very minor damage from a few leaks, but that was it. The trusty clubhouse built in the 1960s stood strong!

A big shout out to all those members who have assisted in working bees etc. during the last season, it is very much appreciated and nearly time for the next one prior to the commencement of next season. Also, just a quick mention about one of our clubhouse occupants for many years – Bessy the Tractor. Bessy has finally been retired this season with the new Kubota tractor now servicing our needs. Bessy went to a good home and is still part of the NK Family.

Finally, I must thank Meagan Lowns for her assistance throughout the season and also those members that helped out during the cyclone, keeping the generator running and the club safe. Until next season, stay safe and we will see you all back at the Club for another successful season

We didn't have any major changes or upgrades to the Supporters Club facilities, aside from a couple of new gaming machines. The City of Gold Coast did some upgrades to the downstairs park area in front of the club, providing a great area with new artificial grass and park



bench tables for the café. Some computer equipment was replaced following damage from Cyclone Alfred in March 2025. This event provided disruption to trade, with the club remaining closed for a 10 day period due to ongoing power issues following the cyclone but otherwise fared relatively well in the weather event. The membership system for the Supporters Club was transitioned over to a rewards point system from a discount system, now rewarding our loyal members for their continued patronage.
